


(There were 283 returns of which 208 were responders who received repeat prescriptions)


The scope of the Survey was to establish whether or not the issuing of repeat prescriptions was leading to a wastage problem with regard to prescription drugs, medicines and appliances.

Q.1. Do you receive regular repeat prescriptions?





Yes responses broken down by Gender and Age






Q.2. What do you do when you need a repeat prescription?







Of those ordering their own repeat prescriptions, how many experienced dispensing errors?





Q.4. Which medicines/goods do you order regularly?




Q.5. When do you normally re-order your repeat prescription?




Of those responding that the pharmacist orders, the majority reported they received their repeat order every month. A small minority received them every two months with a couple of returns recording every two weeks and "as and when"

Q.6. Has your prescription ever been wrong?






Of those reporting an "Other" mistake the mistake was related to missing items.


Q.7. Do you ever check what medicines/goods you have been given before you leave the chemists?




How many patients, <u>reporting a mistake</u> in their dispensed prescriptions, checked their medicines before leaving the chemist?



Q.8. Do you take your medication according to the instructions from the Dr /Nurse/Pharmacist?






Q.10. Do you ever receive medicines/goods you no long take or use?




How many of those patients for whom the <u>chemist dispensed automatically</u>, received items they no longer take or use?




How many of those who <u>ordered their own prescriptions</u> received items they no longer use or need?








Q.13. Are you aware that when taking repeat prescriptions you need to have a regular review at least annually with a Dr / Nurse/ Pharmacist?
